Creation of FoV

- Founded: 1st February 2014
- 16 founding members met in Leeds, Yorkshire, UK and signed the creation of the organisation and elected provisional committee members.
- There had been two earlier consultation meetings prior to the creation of the Organisation.



Friends of Victoire as a movement:

No political party's affiliation

Friends of Victoire is independent, not in competition, not an extension, not in opposition to any political party.

- An international movement beyond the Rwandan community FoV aims to be a platform where any one, regardless of nationality, age, race or other background, can join to further the organisation's aim.
- A membership association and a grassroots movement FoV depends on voluntary participations and contributions of members who give their time and talents to support the organisation.
